

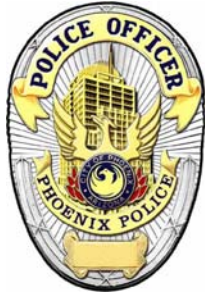

Monday August 23, 2010 **New Police Precinct Boundaries Go Into Affect for Phoenix Police Department**

Only that some of you will now be patrolled by officers working out of the Squaw Peak Precinct, and a few others by officers of the South Mountain Precinct. Balsamic Glazed Pork Loin Chops

- 2 Tablespoons Olive Oil
- 4 boneless pork loin chops 1” thick
- Salt and pepper
- 4 slices Turkey Bacon, diced
- 1 red onion, sliced thin
- 1 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- ½ cup balsamic vinegar
- 2 Tablespoons Splenda brown sugar, packed
- ½ cup low sodium chicken broth

Preheat sauté pan over medium high heat. Add oil and then the chops to sear. Salt and pepper and cook 2 minutes, turn, salt and pepper other side and cook another 2 minutes. Remove to a plate.

In same pan add bacon and cook till crisp, remove to drain on paper towel lined plate. In same pan add onion and thyme and cook till caramelized for about 6-8 minutes or is tender and has developed color. Add garlic and cook stirring continuously for additional 30 seconds (garlic burns quick so watch it carefully). Lower heat to medium.

Add vinegar and brown sugar, stir and let simmer till liquid reduces by half. Add chicken broth, stir, and the chops back to the pan covering with the vinegar onion mixture and let finish cooking another 6-8 minutes in liquid. Do not cover with lid, you want the liquid to reduce again to concentrate the flavors and thicken slightly.

Enjoy with a salad of healthy greens and maybe some cottage cheese with grilled peaches.
