Phoenix's Response to Drought and How it Impacts the City

Earlier this month, the United States Bureau of Reclamation declared the first-ever Tier 1 Shortage on the Colorado River, beginning in January 2022. This shortage comes as a result of persistent declines in Colorado River flows as a result of long-term drought conditions, over allocation of available river resources, and climate change.

Phoenix Water will continue to provide safe, clean, and reliable water to its customers without interruptions. However, it is essential that residents and business owners do their part to be water smart and embrace a desert lifestyle by using water wisely.

Drought Pipeline Project

Construction on the 66-inch pipeline is underway and schedule to be complete in early 2023. The pipeline project that will connect to the new pump station on 31st Street south of Bell Road also began last month. Construction for the rehabilitation/replacement 48-inch pipeline is complete. This pipeline was repaired/replaced to avoid failure of the pipe, which carries 35 million gallons of tap water a day to North Phoenix.

To help keep community members updated on construction updates and alerts, the city has launched the Pipeline Project mobile app. The free app is now available for download on your iPhone or Android's app store.

Sky Harbor Updates

Passenger Traffic

More than 3.8 million passengers traveled through Sky Harbor in July. That passenger total is only 0.3% lower than July 2019 before the COVID-19 pandemic. July 2021 was 182.6% higher than July 2020 when more than 1.35 million people traveled through Sky Harbor.

COVID-19 Updates

TSA extended the Security Directive (SD) requiring masks in airports and on transportation conveyances through January 18, 2022. The extension is designed to help minimize the spread of the COVID-19 Delta variant. This extension applies to individuals across all transportation networks throughout the United States, including at airports, onboard commercial aircraft, on over-the-road buses, and on commuter bus and rail systems. Masks are required in airport terminals, onboard the PHX Sky Train®, and on the Rental Car Center Shuttle buses.

British Airways to Return

After a year and a half hiatus due to COVID-19 related restrictions, British Airways resumed service between Phoenix and London on August 31. The nonstop flight operates three times a week. The flight departs Phoenix at 7:15 p.m., arriving in London the next day at 1:15 p.m. It then departs London at 2:15 p.m. arriving in Phoenix at 5:05 p.m. It is operated by a Boeing 777-200. It offers 272 seats with three classes of service. There are 48 seats in Club World (business class), 40 seats in World Traveler Plus (premium economy) and 184 seats in economy.

Street Pavement Maintenance

Street Transportation crews continue working hard around District 3 and citywide!

In District 3 alone, crews have completed 89.1 miles of mill and overlay work, 120 miles of preservation treatments, 137.7 miles of crack seal, and 2,269 ADA ramps (from July 1, 2018 to July 31, 2021).

City of Phoenix Awarded \$890,180 for Highway Safety Programs in Arizona



The Arizona Governor's Office of Highway Safety (GOHS) recently awarded the City of Phoenix \$890,180 in grant funding for several highway safety programs. GOHS funds support new traffic safety programs and enhance existing programs in the City Prosecutor's Office and the Phoenix Fire and Police departments.

The Prosecutor's Office was awarded \$102,257 to support the Traffic Safety

Resource Prosecutor Program. The program has four primary objectives: provide training for prosecutors and law enforcement officers in the prosecution of traffic safety-related crimes; serve as a resource for questions about traffic laws and trial advocacy; improve communication between prosecutors, law enforcement officers and members of the judiciary; and act as a liaison for individuals and agencies committed to the enforcement and prosecution of traffic safety-related crimes.

The Phoenix Fire Department was awarded \$157,388 from GOHS to fund four programs: \$91,362 for the Occupant Protection and Child Car Seat Program; \$26,500 for the DUI Youth Alcohol Awareness Program; \$29,526 for the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program; and \$10,000 for the Distracted Driving Program.

The Phoenix Police Department was awarded \$630,535 from GOHS to fund four programs: \$353,035 for the DUI Enforcement Program; \$40,100 for the Occupant

Protection Program; \$45,000 for the Pedestrian and Bicycle Safety Program; and \$192,400 for Traffic Services Program.

Funding is provided through September 30, 2021.
