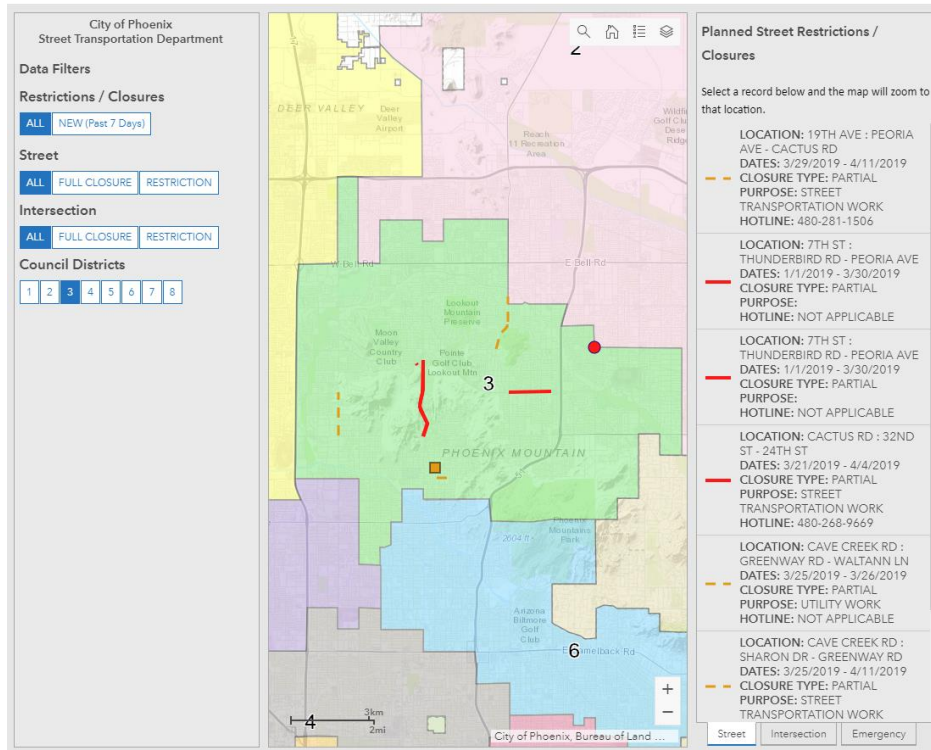

New Interactive Map for Planned Major Street Restrictions and Closures



To provide city residents and visitors with near real-time information about planned major street restrictions and closures, the Street Transportation Department launched a web-based, mobile friendly interactive [map](#) tool.

The new map includes pan, zoom and sorting tools that allow users to interact with the map to change the display on the map. The interactive map can be sorted to display current and future street restrictions and closures associated with private development, special events, utility work and street construction/maintenance; and can also be sorted to display emergency street closures.

Pedestrian Safety

No matter how you travel on Phoenix's roadways, safety should always come first. People who drive, walk and ride bicycles all share responsibility to ensure roadway safety.



Safety Tips

- Always stay alert, **DON'T** drive distracted
- Follow posted speed limits and **STOP** on red
- Yield to pedestrians and bicyclists; be especially aware and careful to yield when turning
- Look left, right, and left again before turning onto a new roadway
- **DON'T** encroach into crosswalks
- Ensure at least three feet alongside to safely pass bicyclists

DRIVE SMART



- Stay alert and **DON'T** walk distracted
- Wear bright, reflective clothing when dark
- Look left, right, and left again (before you enter the roadway)
- Make eye contact with drivers
- Cross the street at designated crosswalks or intersections
- Stay on the sidewalk (when available)
- Read and follow all roadway signs

- Stay bright at night - wear bright clothing and use lights
- Wear proper protective gear
- Obey traffic signs and signals
- Ride with the flow of traffic (when possible)
- Slow down and check for oncoming traffic before entering any street or intersection
- Use appropriate hand signals when making turns



Accelerated Pavement Maintenance Program

Share your input

Between January 2019 and June 2023, the Street Transportation Department will undertake its largest and most comprehensive pavement maintenance program to accelerate pavement maintenance work on many of the city’s major streets.

More than 250 major-street miles will be repaved – a 300 percent increase compared to the number of major-street miles the city traditionally paves each year.

The accelerated program will be accomplished along with the city’s pavement preservation program for local and collector streets, which typically includes 200 street miles per year. The acceleration will significantly improve the condition of city streets.
