Accelerated Pavement Maintenance Program

Share your input

Between January 2019 and June 2023, the Street Transportation Department will undertake its largest and most comprehensive pavement maintenance program, which entails accelerating pavement maintenance work on many of the city's major streets.

During this time, more than 250 major-street miles will be repaved as part of the accelerated pavement maintenance program. This represents a 300 percent increase compared to the number of major-street miles the city traditionally paves each year.



The accelerated program will be accomplished in conjunction with the city's pavement preservation program for local and collector streets, which typically includes 200 street

miles per year. The acceleration of the city's pavement maintenance program will significantly improve the condition of city streets.

March 12, 2019 - Special Election

On Tuesday, March 12, 2019, the City of Phoenix will conduct a Special Election for Mayor and Districts 5 and 8.

Registered Phoenix voters will elect a Mayor in the Runoff Election to serve the remainder of a term that expires April 19, 2021.

Registered voters residing in Phoenix Council District 5 will elect a Councilmember to serve the remainder of a term that expires April 19, 2021, and registered voters residing in Phoenix Council District 8 will elect a Councilmember to serve the remainder of a term that expires April 17, 2023 (pursuant to a recent Charter amendment approved by voters and signed by the Governor).



Voting Centers

This City of Phoenix Special Election will be a [Voting Center](#) election. The voting centers for this election will be open for three days:

- Saturday, March 9 from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.
- Monday, March 11 from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Tuesday, March 12 (Election Day) from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m.

Parks and Facilities Code of Conduct



The Parks and Recreation Department is in the next phase of the process in creating a Code of Conduct to govern city parks and facilities. The policy will address behaviors that violate park rules, and city and state regulations. It

will also ensure that parks and facilities are safe and accessible to the public.

In January, the Parks and Recreation Department held a series of public meetings to gather input on behaviors/solutions of concern to the community, and that input has been used in the development of a DRAFT Code of Conduct. They will now be sharing the draft policy with the community for additional feedback through a series of eight public meetings in March.

North Mountain Tower Road Project Update

The Parks and Recreation Department – Natural Resources Division has provided an update on the North Mountain Tower Road Project, which was last reported on in December 2018. The project completion date is now **mid-late June 2019**.

The project began in February 2018 to make tower upgrades on the public safety communication facilities. Road improvements and resurfacing are also being made to allow construction equipment access to the tower site for improvements. The purpose of the project is to improve access to the public safety towers located at the summit of North Mountain to allow for tower IT upgrades.

During this time, there is a road closure for the duration of the project improvements and a permanent closure of the small parking lot at the tower road entrance on 7th Street.

Circle the City in Sunnyslope in partnership with HonorHealth



Tuesday, March 5, Councilwoman Debra Stark stopped by the Open House of the new Circle the City/Honor Health Mobile Clinic in Sunnyslope to learn about the partnership and the services offered for the homeless in our community.

Circle the City, a non-profit community health organization that serves people experiencing homelessness in Maricopa County, is partnering with HonorHealth John C. Lincoln Medical Center to serve Sunnyslope patients experiencing homelessness.

The medical mobile unit will provide illness and injury treatment, chronic disease management, flu shots and immunizations, and a behavioral health consultant. Staff will also engage additional homeless service providers, neighborhood associations, business coalitions and social service agencies to address the complex health and social needs of the chronically homeless.

In late February, the Mobile Clinic began to park on the John C. Lincoln Camp on Mondays and at St. Vincent de Paul on Tuesdays.
