

The Grand Canalscape is Coming to Maryvale



The City of Phoenix Street Transportation Department is continuing enhancements to the Grand Canal. Phase 3 of the project will transform the dirt path between 75th Avenue and 47th Avenue to an improved concrete pathway, introducing a new route for commuting and

recreating with safe crossings where the trail crosses city streets. Salt River Project (SRP) operates the canal system and is collaborating with the City of Phoenix on this exciting new project. The Maryvale section of the Grand Canal accommodates a lot of pedestrian and bicycle use, so an improved Canalscape project will be bring a recreation or commuting alternative to navigating nearby roads. Housing Department Providing COVID-19 Vaccine to Residents


